AN ACT APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF TEN BILLION PESOS FOR THE AID, RELIEF, RESETTLEMENT AND REHABILITATION SERVICES OF THE VICTIMS AND AREAS AFFECTED, AND FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF NEW INFRASTRUCTURE OR REPAIR AND RECONSTRUCTION OF INFRASTRUCTURE DAMAGED OR DESTROYED BY THE ERUPTION OF MT. PINATUBO

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to assist the victims in the communities damaged or destroyed or adversely affected by the eruption of Mt. Pinatubo and its aftereffects by extending to them adequate aid, relief, resettlement and rehabilitation services and by undertaking

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construction or repair and reconstruction of infrastructure to the end that life may return to normal at the earliest possible time.

Countless persons and organizations here and abroad, as well as foreign governments, have spontaneously and unselfishly contributed their time, effort and money, at the risk of their lives, to the rescue and relief efforts. The State acknowledges such acts of compassion and humanity.

SEC. 2. Statement of Objectives and Guidelines. - This Act is intended to help the victims in the communities which suffered loss or damage from the eruption of Mt. Pinatubo and its aftereffects. It aims to provide additional funds for the immediate relief of the victims, to establish resettlement centers, homesites and townsites for displaced families, to provide livelihood and employment opportunities, to repair and reconstruct government infrastructure damaged or destroyed by said disaster and to construct new infrastructure facilities to prevent further loss of lives or damage to property.

The term "victims" when used for purposes of this Act refers to persons who were displaced, sustained injuries or died as a result of the aforementioned eruption and its aftermath. It also includes those whose homes or properties have been damaged or destroyed,

1		or are threatened to be requiring aid, relief, resettlement and
2	•	rehabilitation services. In case of death, the heirs of the deceased
3		victims shall be entitled to the aid, relief, resettlement and
4		rehabilitation services granted herein.

SEC. 3. Guidelines in the Allocation of Funds. - Government funds and resources herein appropriated shall be spent judiciously and effectively in consonance with the principle of providing the greatest good for the greatest number. Accordingly, the following guidelines shall be observed in allocating the funds made available under this Act:

- (a) In the construction or repair and reconstruction of government infrastructure and facilities, priority shall be given to resettlement centers, homesites and townsites, and such other projects as river system and drainage works, roads, bridges, communication and power lines, hospitals, schoolbuildings, irrigation and water systems, and the like;
- (b) Aid, relief, resettlement and rehabilitation services shall be equitably extended to all victims, irrespective of political or party affiliation, sex, creed, religious belief, or ethnic origin, giving emphasis to livelihood and employment opportunities;
 - (c) Funds shall be allocated for the acquisition by

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- (d) In no case shall any portion of the sum herein appropriated shall be used in payment of any subsisting obligation contracted before the passage of this Act; and
- (e) Any person who takes advantage of the calamity for undue personal and private gain such as profiting in buying and selling or misrepresenting the source of relief goods, submitting false or inflated damage reports and other illegal acts shall be prosecuted and punished to the fullest extent of the law.
- SEC. 4. Appropriations Clause. The sum of Ten billion pesos (\$\mathbb{P}\$10,000,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the National Treasury not otherwise appropriated, including the amount of One billion pesos (P1,000,000,000.00) from the Oil Price Stabilization Fund (OPSF) which is hereby transferred to the General Fund.
 - SEC. 5. Replenishment Scheme. Funds drawn from the treasury for disbursements made under this Act shall be replenished by proceeds from loans, grants or contributions under the Philippine Assistance Program, proceeds and the sale of real

property of the national government, and revenue from tax enhancement measures.

SEC. 6. Determination of Beneficiaries and Projects. - The President or his authorized representative in consultation with national and local officials of the calamity areas, both elective and appointive, as well as accredited NGOs shall determine and approve the beneficiaries of aid, relief, resettlement and rehabilitation services, and determine and approve on the basis of actual damage, certified by the department, office or agency concerned, the government infrastructure projects which shall be financed from the appropriation authorized herein. The information concerning such beneficiaries and projects shall be disseminated in the affected areas.

SEC. 7. Implementation. - The survey, construction or repair and reconstruction of damaged or destroyed or required or alternate government infrastructure and facilities shall be undertaken by the implementing government agencies concerned by public bidding, administration or through negotiated contracts, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. However, in case of negotiated contracts, only duly prequalified and duly licensed contractors as of the approval of this Act can be

	1	awarded such contracts. Whenever suitable labor based technology
	2	shall be used in the implementation of the projects.
	3	With respect to aid, relief, resettlement and rehabilitation
	4	services to individual beneficiaries, the President may seek the
	5	assistance and use the services of the Philippine National Red Cross
	6	and all other relief agencies and volunteer-organizations with
	7	proven record in providing relief work.
	8	SEC. 8. Obligation of Funds Funds herein appropriated
	9	shall be available for the incurrence of obligations until fully

0	SEC. 12. Repealing Clause Any law, decree, rules and
1	regulations which are inconsistent with or contrary to the
2	provisions of this Act are hereby amended or repealed.
3	SEC. 13. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect upon
