AN ACT
CREATING THE MT. PINATURO AID AND DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY,
APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Mt. Pinatubo Aid and Development Authority Act of 1992."

SEC. 2. <u>Declaration of Policy</u>. — It is hereby declared the policy of the State to help and assist the victims or their legal heirs in those communities adversely affected by the eruption of Mt. Pinatubo by extending to them adequate aid, relief, resettlement and rehabilitations services to the end that life may return to normal at the earliest possible time.

SEC. 3. Statement of Objectives. - This Act is 9 to help the victims or their legal heirs in those communities 0 adversely affected by the eruption of Mt. Pinatubo and its after 11 While the extent of the damage cannot be compensated to 12 the fullest, this Act aims to provide initial funds for the 13 immediate relief of the victims or their legal heirs, establish adequate resettlement centers, homesites and towhsites for displaced families, to provide livelihood and employment 17 opportunities, to repair and reconstruct 18 infrastructure damaged or destroyed by said disaster and to

1 construct new infrastructure facilities toprevent further loss of 2 lives or damage to property.

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The term "victims" when used for the purpose of this Act refers to inhabitants who were displaced and who sustained serious injuries or suffered death in the family as a result of the aforementioned eruption. It also includes individuals whose homes have been destroyed or rendered uninhabitable requiring aid in the form of accommodation in temporary shelters and/or food sustenance while they are rebuilding their dwelling places.

SEC. 4. Creation of the Mt. Pinatubo Aid and Development.

11 Authority. - There is hereby created a body corporate called

12 the Mt. Pinatubo Aid and Development Authority hereinafter

13 referred to as the Authority.

It shall be organized within thirty (30) days after the approval of this Act. It shall have a term of seven (7) years from its organization: Provided. That the President by proclamation may extend the period of its existence for not more than three (3) years.

- SEC. 5 <u>Powers of the Authority</u>. To carry out its objectives under this Act, the Authority shall have the following powers:
- 22 a) To formulate policies and plans for the relief, 23 rehabilitation, and resettlement activities of the national 24 government;
- 25 b) To prioritize and coordinate the various projects and 26 programs;
- 27 c) To succeed in its corporate name, to sue and be sued in 28 such corporate name, and to adopt, alter and use a corporate seal 29 which shall be judicially noticed;

- d) To enter into, make, perform and carry out contracts of every class, kind and description which are necessary or incidental to the realization of its purposes with any person, firm or corporation, private or public, and with foreign government entities;
- To contract loans, indebtedness, credit and issue commercial papers and bonds, in any local or convertible foreign government entities, and local or foreign private commercial banks or similar institutions under terms and conditions prescribed by law, rules and regulations:
- 11 f) To monitor the progress of the relief, rehabilitation, 12 and resettlement projects and programs;
- g) To coordinate with concerned local chief executives in the prioritization and prosecution of the projects and programs;

  h) To call upon any department, office, instrumentality,

- 21 j) In general, to perform such other powers as may be 22 necessary and proper to carry out the purpose of this Act.
- SEC. 6. Board of Directors. The Authority shall be governed by a Board of Directors of nine (9) members to be appointed by the President, four (4) coming from the Cabinet, four (4) from the private sector representing the academe, business and industry, agriculture, and non-government and organizations and the Executive Director as Ex-Oficio member. Of the eight (8) directors, three (3) shall serve for a term of six (6) years, three (3) for a term of four (4) years and two (2)

SEC. 7. Executive Director, Powers and Responsibilities;

2 - The President shall appoint a professional

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The President shall appoint a professional manager as the Executive Director of the Authority with a compensation to be determined by the Board, who shall serve as the Chief Executive Officer of the Authority. He shall serve until such time as the Authority is dissolved or unless sooner removed from Office by the President. He shall have the following powers and functions:

- a) Execute and administer the policies and decisions of the Board of Directors;
  - b) Directly coordinate the activities of all agencies and instrumentalities of the Government in the planning and implementation of projects on site;
- c) Monitor the programs and evaluate the effects of project execution by these agencies and instrumentalities and submit to the Board periodic reports relating to the development of the areas:
- d) Apply for, receive and accept grants and donation of the funds, equipment, materials and services needed for the development of the area, within and outside the Philippines; and
- 20 e) Perform such other functions as are inherently necessary in the operational management of the areas development in accordance with the policies and guidelines formulated by the Board of Directors.
- SEC. 8. Preference to Local Residents. Residents in the affected areas, especially the victims, shall be given preference in hiring or employment in the repair or reconstruction of damaged or destroyed government infrastructure and facilities.
- SEC. 9. <u>Limitation in the use of Funds</u>. No money shall be released without any identified program and project nor shall

- 1 it be used to pay obligations incurred before the approval of 2 this Act.
- 3 SEC. 10. Report to Congress. The Authority shall submit
- 4 to the Fresident and Congress a quarterly report on the funds
- obligated and/or disbursed under this Act, including a list of
- 6 the specific projects as well as a list of individual
- beneficiaries and contractors, the purposes of which the fund was
- 8 utilized, the progress of the work, and an evaluation of the work
- 9 so far accomplished.
- 10 SEC. 11. Appropriations. The sum of Ten billion
- (P10,000,000,000.00) pesos is hereby appropriated out of any
- 12 .funds in the National Treasury not otherwise appropriated.
- Said Ten billion (P10,000,000,000.00) pesos shall be
- 14 programmed as follows:
- 15 (see a) For the sonfirst year, the sum of
- 16 five billion (P5,000,000,000.00) pesos for resettlement and
- 17 livelihood;
- 18 b) For the second year, the sum of three billion
- 19 (P3,000,000,000.00) pesos; and
- 20 c) For the third year, the sum of two billion
- 21 (P2,000,000,000.00) pesos.
- 22 Any subsequent funding as may be necessary shall be
- 23 provided in the Annual General Appropriations Act.
- 24 SEC. 12. Punishable Acts. Any person who takes
- 25 advantage of the calamity by buying and selling relief goods
- 26 intended for donation, or misrepresenting the source of relief
- 27 goods, or submitting false or inflated claims shall be
- 28 prosecuted, and upon conviction, suffer a fine of not less than
- 29 fifty thousand (P50,0000.00) pesos nor more than five hundred
- 30 thousand (P500,000.00) or imprisonment of not less than three (3)
- 31 years nor more than five (5) years, or both, in the discretion

- 2 associations or other juridical entity, the penalty shall be
- 3 imposed upon the officer or officers of the corporation,
- 4 partnership, association, or entity responsible for the
- 5 Violation, and if such officer is an alien, he shall in addition
- 6 to the penalties prescribed, be deported without further
- 7 proceedings after service of sentence.
- 8 SEC. 13. Assistance by other Relief Agencies. With
- 9 respect to aid, relief, resettlement and renabilitation services
- 10 to individual beneficiaries, the President may seek the
- 11 assistance and use the services of the Philippine National Red
- 12 Cross and other relief agencies and volunteer-organization
- 13 with proven record in providing such services.
- 14 SEC. 14. Rules and Regulations. The President shall
- 15 within fifteen (15) days from the approval of this Act issue the
- 16 necessary rules and regulations for the effective implementation
- 17 of this Act.
- 18 SEC. 15. <u>Separability Clause</u>. If any provision of this
- 19 Act shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, the other
- 20 provisions not otherwise affected shall remain in full force and
- 21 effect.
- 22 SEC. 16. Repealing Clause Any law, decree, rules and
- 23 regulations which are inconsistent with or contrary to the
- 24 provisions of this Act are hereby amended or repealed.
- 25 · SEC. 17. · Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take
- 26 effect upon its publication in at least two (2) national
- 27 newspapers of general circulation.
