The House having passed a Bill (H. No. 1050) similar to this Bill, said House asked for a conference on July 3, 1959, in case the Senate insisted on its Bill, having designated as representatives on its part Congressmen Apacible, Roy and Villareal;

Conference Report was submitted with the statement that the Conference Committee has reached an agreement on the disagreeing votes of both Houses, and agreed to by the Senate on July 4, 1959;

The House approved the Report of the Conference Committee on the same day;

Enrolled copies of the Bill were sent to the President of the Philippines for his action on July 13, 1959;

Approved by the President of the Philippines on July 16, 1959; Converted into Republic Act No. 2610.

20. - An Act empowering the Secretary of Education to reorganize the Philippine Nautical School, to prescribe courses of instruction and program of training, and to confer the bachelors degree; and authorizing the appropriation of funds therefor. Introduced by Senator Kangleon and filed on Jan. 28, 1958; Submitted to the Senate on Jan. 29, 1958; Referred to the Com. on Education on the same day; Returned by said Com. with the Com. Rept. No. 135, recommending that it be approved with amendments on May 6, 1958; Submitted said Report to the Senate on the same day; (Pending in the Calendar.)

21. - An Act to amend Article Three hundred and thirty-five of the Revised Penal Code. (Re - rape.)
* Introduced by Senator Guenco and filed on Jan. 28, 1958; Submitted to the Senate on Jan. 29, 1958; Referred to the Com. on Revision of Laws on the same day; Returned by said Com. with Com. Rept. No. 8, recommending that it be approved without amendment on Feb. 17, 1958; Submitted said Report to the Senate on the same day; Discussed on March 5 and 24 and April 8, 1958; Passed on second reading by the Senate with amendments on April 8, 1958; Printed copies distributed to the Senators on April 24, 1958; Passed on third reading by the Senate on April 28, 1958; Sent to the House requesting concurrence on April 29, 1958; The House having passed a Bill (H. No. 42), similar to this Bill, and owing to discrepancies found in the provisions of the two measures, said House asked for a conference on May 6, 1959, having designated as representatives on its part Congressmen Zosa, Roces and Roxas; The Senate insisted on its Bill and accepted the conference asked for by the House on May 8, 1959, having appointed as conferees at the same on its part Senators Tolentino, Sumulong and Padilla; Conference Report was submitted with the statement that the Conference Committee has reached an agreement on the disagreeing votes of both Houses, and agreed to by the Senate on May 5, 1960; The House approved the Report of the Conference Committee on May 5, 1960; Enrolled copies of the Bill were sent to the President of the Philippines for his action on May 16, 1960; Approved by the President of the Philippines on June 18, 1960; Converted into Republic Act No. 2632.
