

Senator PRIMICIAS. Mr. President, in the absence of the gentleman from Iloilo, Senator Zulueta, Chairman of the Committee on Transportation and Public Service, I will sponsor this bill because I am one of the authors.

The PRESIDENT. The gentleman from Pangasinán may proceed.

POENCIA DEL SEN. PRIMICIAS

Senator PRIMICIAS. Mr. President, this bill seeks to prohibit the construction of air hazards which may be said to be obstructions to air navigation and to enforce zoning regulations, and prescribes penalties for violations thereof. In these modern times, Mr. President, we need to approve certain precautionary measures against accidents in all our airports in order to allow a maximum margin of safety to the flying public. This bill has been studied by the Civil Aeronautics Administration and it more or less coincides with the provisions of laws adopted in other countries to protect flying and promote traffic by air. I believe, that this bill is necessary to promote the airmindedness of our people in accordance with progressive legislation. I ask that this bill be approved if there are no comments or further remarks.

The PRESIDENT. As many as are in favor of the bill will please say *aye*. (*Several Senators: Aye.*) As many as are against will please say *no*. (*Silence.*) The bill is approved on second reading.
