PRIVILEGE ALLOWING TAX-FREE PURCHASE OF LIVELIHOOD TOOLS AND PROVIDING THE OPPORTUNITY TO AVAIL OF THE NECESSARY TRAINING TO ENABLE THE BALIKBAYAN TO BECOME ECONOMICALLY SELF-RELIANT MEMBERS OF SOCIETY UPON THEIR RETURN TO THE COUNTRY.
