AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A MORE RESPONSIVE NURSING PROFESSION, REPEALING FOR THE PURPOSE REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7164, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "THE PHILIPPINE NURSING ACT OF 1991" AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	ARTICLE I
2	TITLE
3	SECTION 1. Title This Act shall be known as the Philippine
4	Nursing Act of the Year 2002.
5	ARTICLE II
6	DECLARATION OF POLICY
7	SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy It is hereby declared the policy of
8	the State to assume responsibility for the protection and improvement of

the nursing profession by instituting measures that will result in relevant 1 2 nursing education and in humane working conditions, better career 3 prospects and a dignified existence for our nurses. . 4 The State hereby guarantees the delivery of quality basic health 5 services through an adequate nursing personnel system throughout the 6 · country. 7 ARTICLE III 8 ORGANIZATION OF THE BOARD OF NURSING 9 SEC. 3. Name and Composition of the Board. - There shall be 10 created a board of nursing, hereinafter referred to as the board, to be 11 composed of a chairman and four (4) members. They shall be appointed by the President of the Republic of the Philippines from among the two (2) 12 recommendees, per vacancy, of the Professional Regulation Commission, 13 hereinafter referred to as the Commission, chosen and ranked from a list of 14 three (3) nominees, per vacancy, of the accredited professional 15 16 organization of nurses in the Philippines who possess the qualifications prescribed in Section 5 of this Act. 17 SEC. 4. Powers and Duties of the Board. - The Board shall 18 supervise and regulate the practice of the nursing profession and shall have 19 the following powers, duties and functions: 20 (a) Conduct of the licensure examination for nurses; 21 (b) Issue, suspend or revoke certificates of registration for the 22 practice of nursing; 23

1	(c) Study the conditions affecting the nursing practice in the
2	Philippines and exercise the powers necessary to ensure the maintenance of
3	efficient, ethical, technical, moral and professional standards in the practice
4	of nursing, taking into account the health needs of the nation;
5	(d) Examine the facilities of universities or colleges offering or
6	planning to offer Bachelor of Science in Nursing to ensure that standards
7	are properly complied with and maintained at all times. The authority to
8	open and close colleges of nursing shall be vested on the Commission on
9	Higher Education (CHED) upon the recommendation of the Board;
10	(e) Investigate violations of this Act. For this purpose, it may,
11	through its chairman, with the approval of the Board, issue summons,
12	subpoena or subpoena duces tecum to violators of this Act and witnesses
13	thereof and to compel their attendance by the power of contempt; and
14	(f) Promulgate decisions or adopt measures as may be necessary
15	for the improvement of the nursing practice, for the advancement of the
16	profession and for the proper and full enforcement of this Act.
17	The policies, resolutions, rules and regulations, orders, decisions
18	issued or promulgated by the Board shall be subject to the review and
19	approval by the Commission, however, the Board's decisions, resolutions
20	or orders which are not interlocutory, rendered in an administrative case,
21	shall be subject to review only if on appeal.
22	SEC. 5. Qualifications of the Chairman and Members of the Board.
23	- The Chairman and members of the Board shall:
24	(a) Be a natural-born citizen and resident of the Philippines;

1	(b) Be a member in good standing of the accredited professional
2	organization of nurses;
3	(c) Be a registered nurse and holder of a master's degree in nursing
4	conferred by a college or university duly recognized by the government;
5	(d) Have at least ten (10) years of continuous practice of the
6	profession prior to appointment: Provided, however, That the last five (5)
7	years of which shall be in the Philippines; and
8	(e) Not have been convicted of any offense involving moral
9	turpitude.
10	SEC. 6. Requirements Upon Qualification as Member of the Board
11	of Nursing Any person who is appointed as chairman or member of the
12	Board shall automatically resign from any teaching position in any school,
13	college or university offering Bachelor of Science in Nursing and/or review
14	program for the local nursing board examinations or in any office or
15	employment in the government or any subdivision, agency or
16	instrumentality thereof, including government-owned or -controlled
17	corporations or their subsidiaries. He or she shall not have any pecuniary
18	interest in or administrative supervision over any institution offering
19	Bachelor of Science in Nursing including review classes.
20	SEC. 7. Term of Office The chairman and members of the Board
21	shall hold office for a term of three (3) years and until their successors shall
22	have qualified: Provided, That the chairman and members of the Board

may be reappointed for another term not exceeding three (3) years.

1	Any vacancy in the Board occurring within the term of a member
2	shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term only. Each member of
3	the Board shall take the proper oath of office prior to the performance of
4	his or her duties.
5	The incumbent chairman and members of the Board shall be allowed
6	to continue to serve for the remainder of their term under Republic Act No.
7	7164 as chairman and members of the Board created under this Act until a
8	new composition of the Board shall have been set up.
9	SEC. 8. Compensation of Board Members The chairman and
10	members of the Board shall receive compensation and allowances
11	comparable to the compensation and allowances received by the chairman
12	and members of other professional regulatory boards.
13	SEC. 9. Removal or Suspension of Board Members The
14	President may remove or suspend any member of the Board on the
15	following grounds after due process of law:
16	(a) Continued neglect of duty or incompetence;
17	(b) Commission or toleration of irregularities in the licensure
18	examination; and
19	(c) Unprofessional, immoral or dishonorable conduct.
20	SEC. 10. Records All records of the Board, including
21	examination papers, minutes of deliberations, records of administrative
22	cases and investigations and examination results shall be kept by the
23	Commission under the direct custody of the person designated by the

1	chairman of the Commission. No record shall be removed, altered or
2	examined without the prior authorization of the Board.
3	ARTICLE IV
4	EXAMINATION AND REGISTRATION
5	SEC. 11. Licensure Examination All applicants for license to
6	practice nursing shall be required to pass examinations by the Board.
7	The licensure examination for the practice of nursing in the
8	Philippines shall be given by the Board not earlier than one (1) month but
9	not later than two (2) months after the closing of the semester prescribed by
10	CHED. The examination shall be held in the City of Manila or in such
11	places as may be decided by the Board subject to the approval of the
12	Commission.
13	SEC. 12. Qualifications of Applicants In order to be admitted to
14	the examination for nurses, an applicant must, at the time of filing his or
15	her application, establish to the satisfaction of the Board that:
16	(a) He or she is a citizen of the Philippines, or a citizen or subject
17	of a country which permits Filipino nurses to practice within its territorial
18	limits on the same basis as the subject or citizen of such country: Provided,
19	That the requirements for the registration or licensing of nurses in said
20	country are substantially the same as those prescribed in this Act;
21	(b) He or she is in good health and is of good moral character; and
22	(c) He or she is a holder of a bachelor's degree in Nursing from a
23	college or university that complies with the standards of nursing education
24	duly recognized by the proper government agency.

1	SEC. 13. Scope of Examination The scope of the examination for
2	the practice of nursing in the Philippines shall be determined by the Board.
3	The Board shall take into consideration the objectives of the nursing
4	curriculum, the broad areas of nursing and other related disciplines and
5	competencies in determining the subjects of examinations.
6	SEC. 14. Rating in the Examination In order to pass the
7	examination, an examinee must obtain a general average rating of at least
8	seventy-five percent (75%).
9	SEC. 15. Issuance of Certificate of Registration and Professional
10	License A certificate of registration as a nurse shall be issued to
11	applicant who passes the examination upon payment of the prescribed fees.
12	Every certificate of registration shall show the full name of the registrant,
13	the serial number, the signature of the chairman of the Commission and of
14	the members of the Board, and the official seal of the Commission.
15	A professional license, duly signed by the chairman of the
16	Commission, bearing the date of registration, license number and the date
17	of issuance and expiration thereof shall likewise be issued to every
18	registrant who has paid the annual registration fees for three (3)
19	consecutive years.
20	SEC. 16. Fees for Examination and Registration Applicants for
21	licensure examination and for registration shall pay the prescribed fees set
22	by the Commission.

1	SEC. 17. Automatic Registration of Nurses All nurses whose
2	names appear at the roster of nurses shall be automatically or ipso facto
3	registered as nurses under this Act upon its effectivity.
4	SEC. 18. Registration by Reciprocity Certificate of registration
5	and professional license may be issued without examination to nurses
6	registered under the laws of any foreign state or country: Provided, That
7	the requirements for registration or licensing of nurses in said country are
8	substantially the same as those prescribed under this Act: Provided,
9	further, That the laws of such state or country grant the same privileges to
10	registered nurses of the Philippines on the same basis as the subjects or
11	citizens of such foreign state or country.
12	SEC. 19. Practice Through Special/Temporary Permit. —
13	Special/temporary permit may be issued by the Board subject to approval
14	by the Commission and payment of the fees it has prescribed and charged
15	therefore to the following persons:
16	(1) Licensed nurses from foreign countries/states whose services
17	are either for a fee or free if they are internationally well-known specialists
18	or outstanding experts in any branch or specialty of nursing;
19	(2) Licensed nurses from foreign countries/states on medical
20	mission whose services shall be free and limited to indigent patients in a
21	particular hospital, center or clinic; and
22	(3) Licensed nurses from foreign countries/states employed as
23	exchange professors in a branch or specialty of nursing by school/college
24	of nursing.

1	SEC. 20. Non-Registration and Non-Issuance of Certificates of
2	Registration and Professional Licenses or Special/Temporary Permits
3	No person convicted by final judgment of any criminal offense involving
4	moral turpitude or any person guilty of immoral or dishonorable conduct or
5	any person declared by the court as of unsound mind shall be registered and
6	be issued a certificate of registration and a professional license or a
7	special/temporary permit.
8	The Board shall furnish the applicant a written statement setting
9	forth the reasons for its actions which shall be incorporated in the records
10	of the Board.
11	SEC. 21. Revocation and Suspension of Certificate of Registration
12	and Cancellation of Special/Temporary Permit The Board shall have the
13	power to revoke or suspend the certificate of registration or cancel the
14	special/temporary permit of a nurse upon any of the following grounds:
15	(a) For any of the causes mentioned in the preceding section;
16	(b) For unprofessional and unethical conduct;
17	(c) For gross incompetence or serious ignorance;
18	(d) For malpractice or negligence in the practice of nursing;
19	(e) For the use of fraud, deceit or false statements in obtaining a
20	certificate of registration or a temporary/special permit;
21	(f) For violation of this Act, the rules and regulations, Code of
22	Ethics for nurses and technical standards for nursing practice or
23	measure/policy of the Board and the Commission or the conditions and
24	limitations for the issuance of the temporary/special permit; or

1	(g) For practicing his or her profession during and/or beyond the
2	period of his or her suspension from such practice.
3	Provided, however, That the suspension of the certificate of
4	registration shall not be for a period in excess of four (4) years.
5	SEC. 22. Reissuance of Revoked Certificates and Replacement of
6	Lost Certificates The Board may, after the expiration of four (4) years
: 7	from the date of revocation of a certificate for reasons of equity and justice,
8	and when the cause for revocation has disappeared or has been cured and
9	corrected, upon proper application therefor and the payment of the required
10	fees, issue another copy of the certificate of registration.
11	A new certificate of registration to replace the certificate that has
12	been lost, destroyed or mutilated may be issued, subject to the rules of the
13	Board.
14	ARTICLE V
15	NURSING EDUCATION
16	SEC. 23. Nursing Education Program The nursing education
17	program shall provide sound general and professional foundation for the
18	practice of nursing.
19	The learning experiences shall adhere strictly to specific
20	requirements embodied in the prescribed curriculum for the nursing course
21	in policies and standards of nursing education.
22	SEC. 24. Qualifications of the Faculty A member of the faculty
23	in a college of nursing teaching professional courses must:

(a) Be a registered nurse in the Philippines;

1	(b) Have at least three (3) years of clinical practice in a field of
2 .	specialization;
3	(c) Be a member of good standing in the accredited professional
4	organization of nurses; and
5	(d) Be a holder of a master's degree in nursing or other related
. 6	fields conferred by a college or university duly recognized by the
7	government of the Republic of the Philippines.
8	In addition to the aforementioned qualifications, the dean of a
9	college of nursing must have at least five (5) years of experience in
10	teaching.
11	ARTICLE VI
12	NURSING PRACTICE
13	SEC. 25. Scope of Nursing A person shall be deemed to be
14	practicing nursing within the meaning of this Act when he or she singly or
15	in collaboration with another, initiates and performs nursing services to
16	individuals, families and communities in any health care setting. It
17	includes, but not limited to, nursing care during conception, labor, delivery,
18	newborn, infancy, toddler, pre-school, school-age, adolescence, adulthood
19	and older person. It focuses on the promotion of health, prevention of
20	illness, restoration of health and alleviation of suffering or when recovery is
21	not possible, towards a peaceful death, through:
22	(a) Utilization of the nursing process, including assessment, nursing
23	diagnosis, planning, implementation and evaluation of nursing care.
24	Nursing care includes, but not limited to, tradition and innovative

approaches, therapeutic use of self-executing nursing techniques and
procedures, such as internal examination during labor in the absence of
antenatal bleeding, suturing of laceration to control bleeding in the absence
of a physician, comfort measures, health teaching and administration of
legal and written prescriptions for treatment, therapies, medications and
hypodermic, intradermal, intramuscular or intravenous injection, internal
examination, delivery and suturing of laceration according to protocol
established;

- (b) Linkages with community resources and coordination with the health team;
- (c) Motivation of individuals, families and communities, utilization
 of resources and coordination of services with other members of the health
 team;
- (d) Participation in teaching, guidance and supervision of students in nursing education programs, including administration of nursing services in varied settings such as hospitals, homes, communities and the like, undertaking consultation services and engaging in such other activities that require the utilization of knowledge and decision-making skill of a registered nurse; and
- (e) Undertaking nursing and health manpower development training and research and soliciting finances therefor, in cooperation with the appropriate government or private agency:

Provided, however, That this provision shall not apply to nursing students who perform nursing functions under the direct supervision of

1	qualified faculty: Provided, further, That the above provision shall
2	include, but not limited to, the development of advance nursing practice.
3	SEC. 26. Qualifications of Nursing Service Administrators A
4	person occupying supervisory or managerial positions requiring knowledge
5	of nursing must:
6	(a) Be a registered nurse in the Philippines;
7	(b) Be a member in good standing of the accredited professional
8	organization of nurses;
9	(c) Have at least two (2) years experience in general nursing service
10	administration; and
11	(d) Possess a degree of Bachelor of Science in Nursing with at least
12	nine (9) units in management and administration courses at the graduate
13	level.
14	Provided, That a person occupying the position of chief nurse or
15	director of nursing service shall, in addition to the foregoing qualifications,
16	possess:
17	(1) At least five (5) years of experience in a supervisory or
18	managerial position in nursing; and
19	(2) A master's degree major in nursing service administration or its
20	equivalent.
21	Provided, however, That for primary hospitals, the minimum
22	academic qualifications and experiences for a chief nurse shall be as
23	specified under subsections (b), (c) and (d) of this section: Provided,
24	further, That for chief nurses in the public health agencies, he or she must

1	have a master's degree in public health/community health nursing:
2	Provided, furthermore, That those occupying such positions before the
3	effectivity of this Act shall be given a period of five (5) years within which
4	to qualify.
5	ARTICLE VII
6	HEALTH HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT,
7	PRODUCTION AND UTILIZATION
8	SEC. 27. Studies for Nursing Manpower Needs, Production,
9	Utilization and Development The Board and the accredited professional
10	organization of nurses shall undertake studies and initiate and/or cooperate
11	with appropriate government or private agencies in the conduct of studies
12	for health human resource production, utilization and development.
13	ARTICLE VIII
14	PENAL AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS
15	SEC. 28. Prohibitions in the Practice of Nursing A fine of not
16	less than Ten thousand pesos (P10,000.00) nor more than Forty thousand
17

1	(2) Who uses as his or her own, the certificate of registration and/or
2	professional license or special/temporary permit of another;
3	(3) Who uses an expired or invalid professional license, a
4	suspended or revoked certificate of registration, or an expired or cancelled
5	special/temporary permit;
6	(4) Who gives any false evidence to the Board in order to obtain a
7	certificate of registration, a professional license or special/permit;
8	(5) Who falsely poses or advertises as a registered and licensed
9	nurse or uses any other means that tend to convey the impression that he or
10	she is a registered and licensed nurse;
11	(6) Who appends B.S.N./R.N. (Bachelor of Science in
12	Nursing/Registered Nurse) to his or her name without having been
13	conferred said degree or registration; or
14	(7) Who, as a registered and licensed nurse, abets or assists the
15	illegal practice of a person who is not lawfully qualified to practice nursing.
16	(b) Any person who undertakes in-service educational programs or
17	who conducts review classes for both local and foreign examination
18	without permit/clearance from the Board and the Commission; and
19	(c) Any person violating any provision of this Act and its rules and
20	regulations.
21	SEC. 29. Enforcement of this Act It shall be the duty of all duly
22	constituted law-enforcement agencies and officers of national, provincial,
23	city or municipality governments to enforce the provisions of this Act and
24	to prosecute any person violating the same.

1	SEC. 30. Appropriations The chairman of the Professional
2	Regulation Commission shall immediately include in its program and issue
3	such rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this Act, the
4	funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations
5	Act.
6	SEC. 31. Rules and Regulations The Board shall promulgate
7	such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the provisions
8	of this Act.
9	SEC. 32. Separability Clause If any part of this Act is declared
10	unconstitutional, the remaining parts not affected thereby shall continue to
11	be valid and operational.
12	SEC. 33. Repealing Clause Republic Act No. 7164, otherwise
13	known as the Philippine Nursing Act of 1991 is hereby repealed. All other
14	laws, decrees, orders, circulars, issuances, rules and regulations and parts
15	thereof which are inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed, amended
16	or modified accordingly.
17	SEC. 34. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
18	after its publication in any newspaper of general circulation in the
19	Philippines.
