PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF SENATOR MACEDA [In Praise of 2nd Lt. Felix P. Brawner III]

Senator Maceda. Mr. President, distinguished Members of the Senate, I stand here today not to bury Felix Brawner III for he was buried yesterday at the Libingan ng Mga Bayani.

I stand here today, Mr. President, indeed, not to criticize, as I have done many times in the past, but to praise 2nd Lt. Felix P. Brawner III and 11 other heroes who died with him in that ambush in Albay, as well as 11 other members of the PMA Class of 1984, who, like him, had gone and met their Creator in some lonely mountain range, many miles away from home, in representation of about 600 officers and men, who died in 1987. The same number will, probably, die again this year.

In our day-to-day disappointment, Mr. President, over our failures and deficiences of Government, it is refreshing and inspiring, as we saw last Saturday in Barrio Gicboan, Silvino Lobos, Northern Samar, to be reminded that there are thousands of young men out there.
