MESSAGE OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE PHILIPPINES

The Secretary.

10 May 1990

Gentlemen:

I have the honor to forward herewith one (1) certified true copy and sixteen (16) additional copies of the Protocol Between the Government of the Republic of the Philippines and the Kingdom of Norway Amending the Convention for the Avoidance of Double Taxation and the Prevention of Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income and on Capital signed at Manila on 22 May 1989 by the former Secretary of Finance, Vicente R. Jayme, and the Norwegian Ambassador to the Philippines, Harald Svan Middtun.

The Protocol amends paragraph 3, Article 15, as well as paragraph 2, Article 29, of the RP-Norway Convention for the Avoidance of Double Taxation on Fiscal Evasion with Respect to Taxes on Income and consists of four Articles.

MACEDA AMENDMENT

Senator Maceda. On page 14, Section 26, line 15, we propose to replace the "Commissioner of the Bureau of Internal Revenue" with "THE SECRETARY OF FINANCE", so that it will cover not only the Bureau of Internal Revenue but the Bureau of Customs, the EIIB, and other agencies under the Department of Finance that would have something to do with this. If the Bureau of Internal Revenue is included, then the others would have something to do with it — the Secretary of Finance.

Senator Pimentel. Accepted, Mr. President.

The President Pro Tempore. Is there any objection? [Silence] There being none, the amendment is approved.

The Chair would like to ask a question and this question relates to matters that are being considered by this Chamber under the bill on environment or pollution control being sponsored by the Senator from Isabela. On page 10, Section 18, we find that there are provisions relative to the Board banning the use of mercury or any other noxious substances in mining areas, et cetera. The Chair would like to know if this provision will be affected by any ultimate decision that might be reached by the Chamber relative to the Pollution Control Bill.

Senator Pimentel. This will be in effect a special rule regarding mining activities. Of course, since the other bill is pending, we can introduce the concept embodied here in that bill. There will be no conflict whatsoever. That would be my proposal.

The President Pro Tempore. In other words, this would be without prejudice to one or the other being changed so as to arrive at a uniform policy or decision.

Senator Pimentel. Certainly, Mr. President.

The President Pro Tempore. The Majority Floor Leader is recognized.

Senator Guingona. Mr. President, I move that we close the period of amendments.

The President Pro Tempore. Is there any objection? [Silence] There being none, the motion is approved.

APPROVAL OF SENATE BILL NO. 1333 ON SECOND READING, AS AMENDED

Senator Guingona. Mr. President, I move that we vote on Senate Bill No. 1333, as amended, on Second Reading.

The President Pro Tempore. We shall now vote on the bill, as amended, on Second Reading. As many as are in favor of the bill, as amended, will please say Aye. [Several Senators: Aye] As many as are against will please say Nay. [Silence] Senate Bill No. 1333, as amended, is approved on Second Reading.

The President. Is there any objection? [Silence] There being none, the motion is approved.

Senator Guingona.
