# **AN ACT**

DEFINING THE CRIME OF ART FORGERY, PROVIDING PENALTIES THERETO, BROADENING THE POWERS OF THE NATIONAL MUSEUM'S PANEL OF EXPERTS, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION. 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Art 1 2 Authentication Act of 2000". **SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy.** - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to 3 protect, conserve, develop and promote the nation's cultural heritage, artistic 4 5 creations and resources. SEC.3. Definition of Terms. - For purposes of this Act, the following terms or 6 7 phrases used shall mean or be understood as follows: a) Work of fine art refers to all original works of art like paintings, sculpture, 8 drawings, and art work produced in multiples such as graphic and 9 photographic works and sculpture casts, but shall not include works 10 intended to be mass-produced for commercial use; 11 b) Art dealer refers to any person or entity who sells or otherwise deals in 12 works of fine art for profit or gain, such as art galleries, art brokers and 13

agents; and

1	c) Art forgeries are committed by any person or entity who commits any of
2	the following acts:
3	i) Affixing or causing to appear a usurped or forged signature or sign on
4	any work of fine art;
5	ii) Counterfeiting or imitating any original signature or sign, with the
6	intent to deceive the public or the buyer as to the authorship of a
7	work of art;
8	iii) Selling or circulating any work of fine art bearing forged or usurped
9	signatures or signs; and
10	iv) Imitating or reproducing any work of fine art with intent to deceive
11	the public as to the authenticity of the work.
12	SEC. 4. Search Committee for the Panel of Experts of the National Museum.
13	- The Board of Trustees of the National Museum, created under RA 8492, is hereby
14	mandated to constitute a Search Committee for the Panel of Experts, to be
15	composed of the following persons:
16	a. The Executive Director of the National Museum, as ex-officio
17	chairperson;
18	b. A Commissioner of the National Commission on Culture and the Arts
19	(NCCA), as nominated by the Chairperson of the NCCA;
20	c. The president of the Philippine Association of Art Galleries;
21	d. Any living National Artist for Visual Arts;
22	e. Two deans of reputable schools of fine arts; and
23	f. The president of the Artists Association of the Philippines;
24	SEC. 5. Functions of the Search Committee for the Panel of Experts The
25	following are the functions of the Search Committee for the Panel of Experts:
26	a. Submit to the National Museum Board of Trustees three (3) names who
27	shall compose the Panel of Experts, whose tenure shall be for a fixed term
28	of two (2) years: and

1	b. Maintain and update a list of individuals, herein called Art Consultants,
2	who are recognized experts in various art fields, indexing such names by
3	area of expertise or other qualifications, which the Panel of Experts may
4	draw upon as the need arises.
5	SEC. 6. Broadening of the Powers of the Panel of Experts of the National
6	Museum In addition to the powers granted to it under Presidential Decree 374
7	and Republic Act 8492, and subject to the issuance by the necessary rules and
8	regulations, the Panel of Experts shall also have the following powers and functions:
9	a. To designate individuals, named by the Search Committee as Art
10	Consultants, to become members of the Panel for particular
11	authentication session/s;
12	b. To verify and certify as original any work of fine art submitted to it for
13	authentication, and to issue the corresponding certificates of
14	authentication;
15	c. Upon proper verification, to accept for registration all original works of
16	fine art submitted by the author;
17	d. To impose and collect authentication and registration fees, and other
18	appropriate fees as it may prescribe;
19	e. To initiate investigation and recommend prosecution of all persons who
20	may have violated the provisions of this Act;
21	f. To promulgate rules and regulations for the proper implementation of the
22	provisions of this act;
23	g. To impose fines and sanctions for violations of its rules and regulations;
24	and
25	h. To perform such other acts as may be necessary to carry out the
26	provisions of this Act.
27	SEC. 7. Qualifications of the Members of the Panel of Experts The
28	members of the Panel must be citizens of the Philippines, at least thirty-five (35)

years of age on the day of their appointment, of reputed competence, integrity, 1 probity and independence of mind, and holders of a degree or equivalent training 2 3 and experience in art conservation, connoisseurship, art history, or visual arts: Provided, That in case of vacancy, the new appointee shall serve the unexpired 4 portion of the term: Provided further, That the members of the Panel of Experts can 5 6 only be re-appointed once. 7 Members of the Search Committee, Panel of Experts and the Art Consultants shall be entitled to receive per diems in accordance with existing rules and 8 9 regulations. SEC. 8. Institutional Relationships. - The National Commission on Culture 10 and the Arts shall retain administrative supervision over the National Museum and 11 12 the Panel of Experts. The Board of Trustees of the National Museum shall act on the appointment 13 of the members of the Panel of Experts submitted to it by the Search Committee. It 14 shall also promulgate the necessary rules and regulations to implement the 15 16 provisions of this Act. The National Museum shall provide administrative and technical support to 17 the Search Committee and the Panel of Experts in the conduct of their mandates. 18 19 The Panel shall enjoy fiscal and policy autonomy, enjoying the same status accorded to the National Museum under Section 34 of Republic Act 8492. 20 SEC. 9. Penalties. - Any person who commits any of the acts enumerated in 21 Section 3 of this Act shall be punished with imprisonment of not less than six (6) 22 years and one (1) day but not more than twelve (12) years, and a fine not less than 23 Five Thousand Pesos (P5, 000) but not more than Five Hundred Thousand Pesos 24 (P500, 000.00). 25 If the acts are committed by a corporation, partnership, or any kind of 26 judicial entity, the penalty provided herein shall be imposed on its chief executive 27 officer and /or other officials responsible thereto. 28

1	If the acts are committed by the art dealers or the owners or operators of art
2	galleries, they shall suffer, in addition to the penalties provided herein, the
3	automatic revocation of their license to operate.
4	Sec. 10. Appropriations For the implementation of the provisions of this
5	Act, the amount of Fifty Million Pesos (P 50,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated and
6	shall be taken from the Organizational Adjustment Fund for the acquisition of the
7	necessary equipment, supplies and expertise.
8	Any and all amounts collected by the Panel of Experts in the exercise of its
9	functions shall be retained by the National Museum to augment its annual
10	appropriations and disbursements therefrom shall be subject to the approval of the
11	Board of Trustees of the National Museum.
12	SEC.11. Separability Clause If any part or provision of this Act shall be
13	held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other provisions thereof which are not
14	affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.
15	SEC. 12. Repealing Clause All laws, executive orders, decrees, rules and
16	regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby
17	repealed, amended or modified accordingly.
18	SEC.13. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days from
19	its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
