AN ACT MODERNIZING THE PROFESSIONAL REGULATION COMMISSION, REPEALING FOR THE PURPOSE PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NUMBERED TWO HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE, ENTITLED "CREATING THE PROFESSIONAL REGULATION COMMISSION AND PRESCRIBING ITS POWERS AND FUNCTIONS," AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. *Title.* – This Act shall be called the "PRC Modernization Act of 1999."

SEC. 2. Statement of Policy. - The State recognizes the important 3 4 role of professionals in nation-building and, towards this end, promotes the sustained development of a reservoir of professionals whose competence 5 6 has been determined by honest and credible licensure examinations and whose standards of professional service and practice are internationally 7 recognized and considered world-class brought about by regulatory 8 9 measures, programs and activities that foster professional growth and advancement. 10

SEC. 3. Professional Regulation Commission. – There is hereby created a three-man commission to be known as the Professional Regulation Commission, hereinafter referred to as the Commission, which shall be attached to the Office of the President for general direction and coordination.

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SEC. 4. Composition. – The Commission shall be headed by one (1) full-time chairman and two (2) full-time commissioners all to be appointed by the President for a term of six (6) years without reappointment to start

from the time they assume office. Appointment to a vacancy that occurs before the expiration of the term of a commissioner shall cover only the unexpired term of the immediate predecessor. At the expiration of the term of the chairman, the most senior of the commissioners shall temporarily assume and perform the duties and functions of the chairman until a permanent chairman is appointed by the President.

No person shall be appointed chairman or commissioner unless he is at least forty (40) years of age, is a professional with a valid certificate of registration and a valid professional license, familiar with the principles and methods of professional regulation and/or licensing and has at least five (5) years of executive or management experience: *Provided*, That, one (1) of the commissioners must be a past chairman/member of a Professional Regulatory Board.

SEC. 5. Exercise of Powers and Functions of the Commission. – The chairman and commissioners shall sit and act as a body to exercise general administrative, executive and policy-making functions of the Commission. The Commission shall establish and maintain a high standard of admission to the practice of all professions and at all times ensure and safeguard the integrity of all licensure examinations.

The chairman shall act as the presiding and chief executive officer of the Commission. As presiding officer, he shall preside over the meetings of the Commission sitting as a collegial body. As chief executive officer of the Commission, he shall be responsible for the implementation

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of the policies of, and the programs adopted by, the Commission for the general administration of the Commission.

- SEC. 6. Compensation and Other Benefits. The chairman and the commissioners shall receive compensation and allowances equivalent to that of a department undersecretary while the commissioners shall receive compensation and allowances equivalent to that of an assistant secretary. The chairman and the members of the Commission shall be entitled to retirement benefits provided under Republic Act Numbered One thousand five hundred and sixty-eight, as amended by Republic Act Numbered Three thousand five hundred and ninety-five.
- SEC. 7. Powers of the Commission. The powers of the Commission are as follows:
 - (a) To administer, implement and enforce the regulatory policies of the national government with respect to the regulation and licensing of the various professions and occupations under its jurisdiction including the maintenance of professional and occupational standards and ethics and the enforcement of the rules and regulations relative thereto;
 - (b) To perform any and all acts, enter into contracts, make such rules and regulations and issue such orders and other administrative issuances as may be necessary in the execution and implementation of its functions and the improvement of its services;
 - (c) To review, coordinate, integrate and approve the policies, resolutions, rules and regulations, orders or decisions promulgated by the various boards with respect to the profession or occupation under their

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jurisdictions including the results of their licensure examinations but their decisions on administrative cases shall be final and executory unless appealed to the Commission within thirty (30) days from the date of promulgation thereof;

(d) To administer and conduct the licensure examinations of the various regulatory boards in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the Commission; determine and fix the places and dates of examinations: Provided, That, when there are two (2) or more examinations given in a year, at least one (1) examination shall be held on weekdays (Monday to Friday): Provided, further, That, if only one (1) examination is given in a year, this shall be held only on weekdays; appoint supervisors and room watchers from among the employees of the government or private individuals with baccalaureate degrees, who have been trained by the Commission for the purpose and who shall be entitled to a daily allowance not to exceed the daily rate of Salary Grade 10 for every examination day actually attended; use the buildings and facilities of public and private schools and other similar facilities, publicly or privately owned, for examination purposes; approve the results of examinations and the release thereof; publish the list of successful examinees; provide schools, colleges and universities, public and private, offering courses for licensure examinations, with copies of test questions on examinations recently conducted by the Commission and copies of the syllabi or terms of specifications of subjects for licensure examinations; adopt measures to preserve the integrity and inviolability of licensure examinations;

(e) To keep and maintain a register of the authorized practitioners of the profession or occupation; approve certificates of registration or licenses signed by all the members of the Board concerned with the official seal of the Board affixed thereto, and issue professional licenses to practice a particular profession, bearing the chairman's name and signature, the licensee's name and picture, registration number and expiry date thereof, except to marine deck and engineer officers who shall be issued certificates of competency by the Board and endorsement only by the Commission: *Provided*, That, a privilege tax receipt (PTR) shall not be issued to a registered professional unless he shall have presented a valid and current professional license;

- (f) To have custody of all the records of the various boards, including examination papers, minutes of deliberation, records of administrative cases and investigations and examination results for control and disposition;
- (g) To determine and fix the amount of fees to be charged and collected for examination, registration, registration without examination, annual license, certification, docket, appeal, replacement, accreditation, including surcharges and other fees not specified under the provisions of Republic Act Numbered Four Hundred Sixty-Five, as amended by Republic Act Numbered Sixty-Five Hundred and Eleven or to charge and collect reasonable fees at the rates higher than the rates provided thereunder subject to the approval by the Office of the President;

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(h) To appoint, subject to the provisions of Civil Service Law and Rules, officials and employees of the Commission necessary for the effective performance of its functions and responsibilities; prescribe their duties and fix their compensation subject to the provisions of Republic Act Numbered Six Thousand Seven Hundred and Fifty-Eight and other existing laws, and grant allowances including other fringe benefits; to assign or reassign personnel as the exigency of the service requires; to organize or reorganize the structure of the Commission in accordance with Section 8 hereof; create or abolish positions or change the designation of existing positions in accordance with a staffing pattern prepared by it and approved by the Office of the President upon the recommendation of the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) to meet the changing conditions or as the need arises: Provided. That, such changes shall not affect the employment status of the incumbents, reduce their ranks and/or salaries nor shall result in their separation from the service;

- (i) To submit and recommend to the President of the Philippines nominees for appointment as members of the various professional regulatory boards from among the respected members in good standing nominated by the bonafide professional organizations accredited by the Commission to fill up existing or probable vacancies;
- (j) Upon recommendation of the Professional Regulatory Board, to approve the registration of and authorize the issuance of a certificate of registration and professional license with or without examination to a foreigner, who is registered under the laws of his country and whose

certificate of registration and professional license have not been suspended 1 2 or revoked: Provided, That, the requirements for the registration or licensing in said foreign state or country are substantially the same as those 3 4 required and contemplated by the laws of the Philippines and that the laws 5 of such foreign state or country allow the citizens of the Philippines to 6 practice the profession on the same basis and grant the same privileges as 7 those enjoyed by the subjects or citizens of such foreign state or country: Provided, further, That, the foreign applicant shall submit competent and 8 9 conclusive documentary evidence, confirmed by the Department of Foreign Affairs showing that his country's existing laws permit citizens of 10 11 the Philippines to practice the profession under the laws and rules and 12 regulations governing citizens thereof: Provided, finally, That, the Commission may, upon recommendation of the Board and after 13 14 consultation with the accredited professional organization concerned, authorize the issuance of a temporary or special permit for not more than 15 16 one (1) year, subject to renewal, to practice the profession, to any foreigner regardless of whether or not reciprocity exists in the practice of his 17 profession between his country and the Philippines under such conditions 18 19 as may be determined by the Commission, if such foreigner is 20 internationally known to be an outstanding expert in his chosen profession 21 or a well-known specialist in any of its branches, and that his services are 22 urgently necessary either for lack or inadequacy of local experts or if such foreign professionals are on a mission in the Philippines to render free 23 24 professional services;

(k) To supervise and control foreign nationals who are authorized by existing laws or granted special permits or holders of professional license and certificate of registration to practice their profession temporarily in the Philippines, to see to it that the terms and conditions for their practice or of their employment are strictly observed and adhered to. The Commission shall likewise supervise and control professionals who were former citizens of the Philippines and who have previously passed Philippine licensure examination for the practice of their profession, who may, while in the country on a visit, sojourn or permanent residence, practice their profession: Provided, That, prior to the practice of their profession, they shall have first registered with the Commission and have paid the proper professional license fee;

(1) In consultation with the Professional Regulatory Board concerned, to recommend to the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) the revision or amendment of the curricula of collegiate professional courses, the completion of or graduation from which shall be a prerequisite for admission to the licensure examination and to the practice of the profession concerned, and in coordination with CHED, assess the performance of the graduates of schools, colleges and universities in licensure examinations;

(m) To exercise administrative supervision over the members of the various professional regulatory boards;

- (n) To promulgate such rules and regulations as may be necessary to effectively implement policies with respect to the regulation and practice of the professions;
- (o) To adopt a program for the full computerization of all licensure examinations given by the various professional regulatory boards including the registration of professionals and other operations of the Commission;
- (p) To hear and decide administrative cases against officials and employees of the Commission who have violated the civil service law and rules and regulations issued thereunder: *Provided*, That, only decisions rendered imposing penalties of suspension exceeding thirty (30) days or a fine in an amount exceeding thirty (30) days salary may be appealed to the Civil Service Commission within fifteen (15) days from receipt of a copy of the decision;
- (q) To conduct investigation *motu proprio* or upon complaint under oath by an aggrieved party against members of the professional regulatory boards for neglect of duty, incompetence, unprofessional, unethical, immoral or dishonorable conduct, commission of irregularities in the licensure examinations which taint or impugn the integrity and authenticity of the results of the said examinations and, if found guilty, to suspend or revoke their certificates of registration and professional licenses and to recommend to the President of the Philippines their suspension or removal from office as the case may be:

- (r) To issue summons, subpoena and subpoena duces tecum in connection with the investigation of cases against officials and employees of the Commission and the members of the Professional Regulatory Boards;
- (s) To hold any person for direct or indirect contempt upon any of the grounds provided in Rule 71 of the Rules of Court as are applicable to the Commission or its hearing officers and impose the penalty therefor;
- (t) To call upon or request any department, instrumentality, office, bureau, institution or agency of the government including local government units to render such assistance as it may require, or to coordinate or cooperate in order to carry out, enforce or implement the professional regulatory policies of the government or any program or activity it may undertake pursuant to the provisions of this Act:
- (u) To initiate an investigation, upon complaint under oath by an aggrieved party, of any person, whether a private individual or a professional, local or foreign, who practices the regulated profession or occupation without being authorized by law, or without being registered with and licensed by the concerned regulatory board and issued the corresponding license or temporary or special permit, or who commits any of the prohibited acts provided in the regulatory laws of the various professions, which acts are criminal in nature, and, if the evidence so warrants, to forward the records of the case to the office of the city or provincial prosecutor for the filing of the corresponding information in

court by the lawyers of the legal services of the Commission who may prosecute said case/s upon being deputized by the Secretary of Justice; and

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(v) To perform such other functions and duties as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act, the various professional regulatory laws, decrees, executive orders and other administrative issuances.

SEC. 8. Offices in the Commission. - The Commission and the various professional regulatory boards shall carry out their functions through the offices of the Chairman of the Commission; the assistant commissioner/s; the Secretary of commissioners: the Commission: the Secretary of the professional regulatory boards; the director for legal services; the director for licensure; the director for regulation and enforcement; the director for international affairs; the director for financial management; the director for administrative services: the director for information technology; the director for professional teachers, and the regional directors. The chairman and commissioners, assistant commissioner/s, directors of offices, chief professional regulation officers, supervising professional regulation officers, legal officers and/or attorneys and administrative officer V of the Commission are authorized to administer oaths.

SEC. 9. Powers, Functions and Responsibilities of the Various Professional Regulatory Boards. – The various professional regulatory boards shall retain the following powers, functions and responsibilities in addition to those provided under their respective professional laws:

(a) To regulate the practice of the professions in accordance with the provisions of their respective professional regulatory laws;

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- (b) To monitor the conditions affecting the practice of the profession or occupation under their respective jurisdictions and whenever necessary, adopt such measures as may be deemed proper for the enhancement of the profession or occupation and/or the maintenance of high professional, ethical and technical standards, and for this purpose, the members of a board may, upon request duly granted by the Commission. personally or through responsible employees of the Commission, conduct ocular inspection or visit industrial, mechanical, electrical or chemical plants or establishments, schools, hospitals, clinics, in cases of complaints, whether under oath or not; laboratories, testing facilities, mines and quarries and other engineering works where registered professionals are employed for the purpose of determining compliance with the provision of laws relative to the practice of the profession or occupation or as an aid in formulating policies relative thereto in accordance with the established policies promulgated by the Commission;
- (c) To hear or investigate cases administrative or criminal arising from violations of their respective laws, the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder and their codes of ethics and, for this purpose, may issue summonses, subpoena and subpoena duces tecum to alleged violators and/or witnesses to compel their attendance in such investigations or hearings: Provided, That, the decision of the Professional Regulatory

Board shall, unless appealed to the Commission, become final and executory after fifteen (15) days from notice of judgment or decision;

- (d) To delegate the hearing or investigation of administrative cases filed before them except in cases where the issue involved strictly concerns the practice of the profession or occupation, in which case, the hearing shall be presided over by at least one (1) member of the board concerned assisted by a legal or hearing officer of the Commission;
- (e) To conduct, through the legal officers/attorneys of the Commission, summary proceedings on violations of their respective regulatory laws and the corresponding rules and regulations issued by the boards to implement their respective laws, including violations of the general instructions to examinees committed by examinees, and render summary judgment thereon which shall, unless appealed to the Commission, become final and executory after fifteen (15) days from notice of decision or judgment;
- (f) Subject to review by the Commission, to approve registration without examination and the issuance of corresponding certificate of registration;
- (g) After due process, to suspend, revoke or reissue, reinstate certificates of registration or licenses for causes provided by law;
- (h) To prepare, adopt and issue the syllabi or tables of specifications of the subjects for examinations in consultation with the academe; determine and prepare the questions for the licensure examinations which shall strictly be within the scope of the syllabus or

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table of specifications of the subject for examination and subject to review by experts in accordance with rules and regulations issued by the boards and approved by the Commission; in case of a specialized subject, to hire a test writer to be paid per item at such rate to be fixed by the Commission: score and rate the examination papers with the name and signature of the Board member concerned appearing thereon and submit the results in all subjects duly signed by the members of the Board to the Commission within ten (10) days from the last day of examination unless extended by the Commission for justifiable cause/s; and subject to the approval by the Commission, determine the appropriate passing general average rating in an examination if not provided for in the law regulating the profession; and (i) To prepare an annual report of accomplishments on programs, projects and activities of the Board for submission to the Office of the President, through the Commission, within thirty (30) days after the close of each calendar year and make appropriate recommendations on issues or problems affecting the profession. Compensation of the Members of the Professional Regulatory Boards. - The members of all the professional regulatory boards shall receive a monthly compensation equivalent to the monthly salary of the position with a Salary Grade of 28: Provided, That the

boards shall receive a monthly compensation equivalent to the monthly salary of the position with a Salary Grade of 28: *Provided*, That the chairman shall each receive a monthly compensation higher by ten percent (10%): *Provided*, *further*, That they shall receive other benefits that may be provided by law: and *Provided*, *finally*, That the members of the Professional Regulation's Regulatory Board shall be limited to the private

- practice of his/her profession of not more than five (5) hours every day
 after securing the authority of the Commission.
- SEC. 11. Persons Qualified to Teach Subjects for Licensure

 Examination in all Professions. In addition to the faculty qualification

 requirement, all schools, colleges and universities, public and private, shall

 ensure that subjects for licensure examinations shall be taught by persons

 who are holders of valid certificates of registration and valid professional

 licenses.

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- SEC. 12. Assistance of Law Enforcement Agency. Any law enforcement agency shall, upon call or request of the Commission or of any Professional Regulatory Board, render assistance in enforcing the regulatory law of the profession including the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder by prosecuting the violators thereof in accordance with law and the rules of court.
 - SEC. 13. Appropriations. The amount necessary to carry out the initial implementation of this Act shall be charged against the current year's appropriations of the Professional Regulation Commission. Thereafter, such sums as may be necessary for the continued implementation of this Act including the requirements for the construction of the PRC building and examination centers shall be included in the succeeding General Appropriations Act.
 - SEC. 14. Authority to Use Income. In addition to the annual appropriations of the Commission provided under the annual General Appropriations Act, the Commission is hereby authorized to use fifty per

centum (50%) of its income of two (2) years preceding the fiscal year, for additional maintenance and other operating expenses and capital outlay requirements, except collections of oath-taking fees which shall be used by the concerned regulatory board in connection with the holding of oath-taking ceremonies of successful examinees, subject to the usual accounting and auditing requirements.

SEC. 15. Penalties for Manipulation and Other Corrupt Practices in the Conduct of Professional Examinations. – (a) Any person who manipulates or rigs licensure examination results, secretly informs or makes known licensure examination questions prior to the conduct of the examination or tampers with the grades in professional licensure examinations shall, upon conviction, be punished by imprisonment of not less than six (6) years and one (1) day to not more than twelve (12) years or a fine of not less than Fifty thousand pesos (P50,000.00) to not more than One hundred thousand pesos (P100,000.00) or both such imprisonment and fine at the discretion of the court;

- (b) In case the offender is an officer or employee of the Commission or a member of the regulatory board, he shall be removed from office and shall suffer the penalty of perpetual absolute disqualification from public office and shall suffer the maximum period the penalties prescribed in the preceding section of this Act;
- (c) The penalty of imprisonment ranging from four (4) years and one (1) day to six (6) years or a fine ranging from Twenty thousand pesos (P20,000.00) to not more than Forty-nine thousand pesos (P49,000.00), or

both imprisonment and fine at the discretion of the court, shall be imposed 1 2 upon the accomplices. The penalty of imprisonment ranging from two (2) years and one (1) day to four (4) years or a fine ranging from Five 3 4 thousand pesos (P5,000.00) to not more than Nineteen thousand pesos 5 (P19,000.00), or both imprisonment and fine at the discretion of the court, 6 shall be imposed upon the accessories. 7 SEC. 16. Implementing Rules and Regulations. – Within ninety (90) 8 days after the approval of this Act, the Professional Regulation Commission, together with representatives of the various professional 9 regulatory boards and accredited professional organizations, the 10 Department of Budget and Management and the Commission on Higher 11 12 Education shall prepare the necessary rules and regulations needed to implement the provisions of this Act. 13 SEC. 17. Transitory Provision. - The incumbent commissioner and 14 the two (2) incumbent associate commissioners shall serve as chairman 15 and commissioners, respectively, under the terms for which they have been 16 appointed without need of new appointments. The incumbent executive 17 director shall likewise serve as assistant commissioner without need of new 18 appointment. 19 SEC. 18. Separability Clause. - If any provision of this Act or the 20 application of such provision to any person or circumstances is declared 21 invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or application of such 22

provisions to other persons or circumstance shall not be affected by such

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declaration.

7	SEC. 20. Effectivity This Act shall take effect after fifteen (15)
8	days following its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2)
9	newspapers of general circulation, whichever is earlier.
