OPENING OF THE SESSION

At 4:05 p.m., the Senate President, Hon. Aquilino Q. Pimentel Jr., called the session to order.

Senator Tatad. Mr. President, I move that we resume consideration of House Bill No. 12228 as reported out under Committee Report No. 656.

What will be the effect of this bill on a decree issued by Mr. Marcos in the past for administrative naturalization? Has that decree lapsed already?

Senator Drilon. There are no longer qualified applicants under that, if I recall correctly although I can reconfirm that, Mr. President.

The President. Yes. Because I would like to find out if that particular decree is still extant. If it is not, then probably we should just put a repealing clause here.
