INTRODUCED BY SENATORS AQUINO ORETA AND OPLE

AN ACT DEFINING THE CRIME OF ART FORGERY, PROVIDING PENALTIES THERETO, BROADENING THE POWERS OF THE NATIONAL MUSEUM'S PANEL OF EXPERTS, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION. 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Art
 Authentication Act of 2000".

3 SEC. 2. *Declaration of Policy.* - It is hereby declared the policy 4 of the State to protect, conserve, develop and promote the nation's 5 cultural heritage, artistic creations and resources.

6 SEC. 3. *Definition of Terms.* - For purposes of this Act, the 7 following terms or phrases used shall mean or be understood as 8 follows:

9 a) Work of fine art refers to all original works of art like 10 paintings, sculpture, drawings, and art work produced in multiples

1 such as graphic and photographic works and sculpture casts, but shall 2 not include works intended to be mass-produced for commercial use; 3 b) Art dealer refers to any person or entity who sells or 4 otherwise deals in works of fine art for profit or gain, such as art 5 galleries, art brokers and agents; and 6 c) Art forgeries are committed by any person or entity who 7 commits any of the following acts: 8 Affixing or causing to appear a usurped or forged i) 9 signature or sign on any work of fine art; Counterfeiting or imitating any original signature or 10 ii) 11 sign, with the intent to deceive the public or the 12 buyer as to the authorship of a work of art; 13 Selling or circulating any work of fine art bearing iii) 14 forged or usurped signatures or signs; and 15 Imitating or reproducing any work of fine art with iv) 16 intent to deceive the public as to the authenticity of 17 the work. 18 SEC. 4. Search Committee for the Panel of Experts of the National Museum. - The Board of Trustees of the National Museum, 19 20 created under RA 8492, is hereby mandated to constitute a Search Committee for the Panel of Experts, to be composed of the following 21 22 persons: 23 a. The Executive Director of the National Museum, as ex-officio 24 chairperson;

- 3 b. A Commissioner of the National Commission on Culture and 1 b. To verify and certify as original any work of fine art 1 the Arts (NCCA), as nominated by the Chairperson of the NCCA; 2 2 submitted to it for authentication, and to issue the corresponding 3 c. The president of the Philippine Association of Art Galleries; 3 certificates of authentication; c. Upon proper verification, to accept for registration all 4 d. Any living National Artist for Visual Arts; 4 5 e. Two (2) deans of reputable schools of fine arts; and 5 original works of fine art submitted by the author; 6 6 d. To impose and collect authentication and registration fees, f. The president of the Artists Association of the Philippines; 7 SEC. 5. Functions of the Search Committee for the Panel of 7 and other appropriate fees as it may prescribe; 8 Experts. - The following are the functions of the Search Committee 8 e. To initiate investigation and recommend prosecution of all 9 for the Panel of Experts: 9 persons who may have violated the provisions of this Act; f. To promulgate rules and regulations for the proper a. Submit to the National Museum Board of Trustees three (3) 10 10 names who shall compose the Panel of Experts, whose tenure shall 11 implementation of the provisions of this Act; 11 be for a fixed term of two (2) years; and 12 g. To impose fines and sanctions for violations of its rules and 12 regulations; and 13 b. Maintain and update a list of individuals, herein called Art 13 14 Consultants, who are recognized experts in various art fields, indexing 14 h. To perform such other acts as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act. such names by area of expertise or other qualifications, which the 15 15 SEC. 7. Qualifications of the Members of the Panel of Experts. Panel of Experts may draw upon as the need arises. 16 16 17 SEC. 6. Broadening of the Powers of the Panel of Experts of 17 - The members of the Panel must be citizens of the Philippines, at least thirty-five (35) years of age on the day of their appointment, the National Museum. - In addition to the powers granted to it under 18 18 of reputed competence, integrity, probity and independence of mind, Presidential Decree 374 and Republic Act 8492, and subject to the 19 19 20 issuance by the necessary rules and regulations, the Panel of Experts 20 and holders of a degree or equivalent training and experience in art

21 shall also have the following powers and functions:

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22 a. To designate individuals, named by the Search Committee as Art Consultants, to become members of the Panel for particular 23 authentication session/s; 24

conservation, connoisseurship, art history, or visual arts: Provided, 21 That in case of vacancy, the new appointee shall serve the unexpired 22 portion of the term: Provided, further, That the members of the 23

24 Panel of Experts can only be re-appointed once.

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1 Members of the Search Committee, Panel of Experts and the 2 Art Consultants shall be entitled to receive per diems in accordance 3 with existing rules and regulations.

SEC. 8. Institutional Relationships. - The National Commission
on Culture and the Arts shall retain administrative supervision over
the National Museum and the Panel of Experts.

7 The Board of Trustees of the National Museum shall act on the 8 appointment of the members of the Panel of Experts submitted to it 9 by the Search Committee. It shall also promulgate the necessary rules 10 and regulations to implement the provisions of this Act.

The National Museum shall provide administrative and technical
support to the Search Committee and the Panel of Experts in the
conduct of their mandates.

The Panel shall enjoy fiscal and policy autonomy, enjoying the
same status accorded to the National Museum under Section 34 of
Republic Act 8492.

17 SEC. 9. *Penalties.* - Any person who commits any of the acts 18 enumerated in Section 3 of this Act shall be punished with 19 imprisonment of not less than six (6) years and one (1) day but not 20 more than twelve (12) years, and a fine not less than Five thousand 21 pesos (P5,000.00) but not more than Five hundred thousand pesos 22 (P500,000.00).

If the acts are committed by a corporation, partnership, or any kind of judicial entity, the penalty provided herein shall be imposed on its chief executive officer and/or other officials responsible thereto.

If the acts are committed by the art dealers or the owners or 1 2 operators of art galleries, they shall suffer, in addition to the penalties 3 provided herein, the automatic revocation of their license to operate. 4 Sec. 10. Appropriations. - For the implementation of the 5 provisions of this Act, the amount of Fifty million pesos 6 (P50,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated and shall be taken from the Organizational Adjustment Fund for the acquisition of the necessary 7 8 equipment, supplies and expertise. 9 Any and all amounts collected by the Panel of Experts in the exercise of its functions shall be retained by the National Museum 10

to augment its annual appropriations and disbursements therefromshall be subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of theNational Museum.

SEC. 11. Separability Clause. - If any part or provision of this
Act shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, other provisions
thereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full
force and effect.

18 SEC. 12. Repealing Clause. - All laws, executive orders, 19 decrees, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with the 20 provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified 21 accordingly.

22 SEC. 13. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen

23 (15) days from its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of

24 general circulation.
