Senator Mercado. I have not discussed this matter with the Philippine Air Force. But from what I have heard and from what I have read, I think there are initial negotiations on the matter. 

Initially, Mr. President, the Pakistanis, as we are aware, purchased F-16s which, in spite of the fact that they were paid for, were not delivered to Pakistan because of some objections of Congress. 44

Initially, there was talk of the same being offered to us. But the latest that I heard is that Indonesia is the one seriously negotiating, albeit there has been a snag in the negotiations after the demonstrations in support of Megawati Sukarno Putri rankled some members of the U.S. Congress. There has been talk that this would be put on hold.

I think if we talk about the F-16s, that would be a possibility, Mr. President.

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Senator Enrile. Are these F-16s, Mr. President, fully equipped with the weaponry available to an F-16 released to the US military? The second of the second s

Senator Mercado. From what I have read, I think that is the problem. In the negotiations, one of the stickier points to be negotiated would be the type of missiles that will be provided with it. We are not aware of anything that has assumed a level of specificity in the area of what is being offered, either to Indonesia or the Philippines. But there would be available if the F-16 is a consideration.

We are aware that there are many very effective missiles air-to-air. We have the sidewinder and the sparrow missiles; the air-to-surface missiles, the harpoon, the maverick, and the Penguin 3. Buster bombs and rockets would be there, and quite a compendium of lethal weapons in one of the most effective fighting machines today.

Senator Enrile. Mr. President, the Philippine Army is, of course, a very important component of our military organization. There is no question that it must be supported right away to modernize itself. and the second second

In the programming of this amount that we are discussing, which of the two services-Navy and Air Force-would be given a margin of advantage, if I will use the word, Mr. President, in terms of procurement?

Senator Mercado. Mr. President, the prioritization is that the Air Force is No. 1. and the Navy is No. 2. The last priority would be the Army, in terms of how much we are spending. But this does not mean that any service is less important in the fulfillment of its functions to perform its mission.

RESOLUTION CONVERTING THE AD HOC COMMITTEE ON ILLEGAL DRUGS TO A PERMANENTCOMMITTEE, AMENDINGFOR THE PURPOSE SECTION 13, RULE X OF THE RULES OF THE SENATE

The following is the whole text of the resolution:

Proposed Senate Resolution No. 616

RESOLUTION CONVERTING THE AD HOC COMMITTEE ON ILLEGAL DRUGS TO A PERMANENT COMMITTEE AMENDINGFOR THE PURPOSE SECTION 13, RULE X OF THE RULES OF THE SENATE

WHEREAS, the Philippines faces a formidable dilemma arising from the uncontrolled proliferation of illegal drug activities, the menacing effects of which are highly visible in our society;

WHEREAS, the illegal drugs trafficking has become a global problem where our country is not spared. In fact, the reports reveal the presence of members of international drug syndicate operating in Asia with Manila as its main base;

WHEREAS, the Senate for its part, signifying its uncompromising stand against drug trafficking, sponsored the passage of R. A. No. 7659 to strengthen the penal provisions of R. A. No. 6425 reimposing death penalty on certain drug offenses, and last February 26, 1996, Senate Resolution No. 21, entitled "Resolution Concurring in the Ratification of the United Nations Convention Against Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotic Substances," was adopted;

WHEREAS, to attune the system to the present condition and to be more responsive in addressing this serious problem, the new Senate leadership finds it meritorious to convert the Ad Hoc Committee on Illegal Drugs into a permanent committee. Now, Therefore, be it

*Resolved by the Senate*, To convert, as it hereby converts, the Ad Hoc Committee on Illegal Drugs to a Permanent Committee.
